Jan. 13-31: Alberta Fisheries Management Open Houses

The Alberta government is hosting a series of open houses across the province from January 13-31 to understand Albertans' perspectives about fisheries and their management. This feedback will be

used as part of an updated fisheries management plan.

AWA believes that the provincial government's top priority should be to take action to recover our threatened native fish - bull trout, westslope cutthroat trout and Athabasca rainbow trout. Our vision is for all fisheries management decisions to be science-based; we believe that achieving native fish recovery while continuing to provide recreational angling opportunities is possible.
