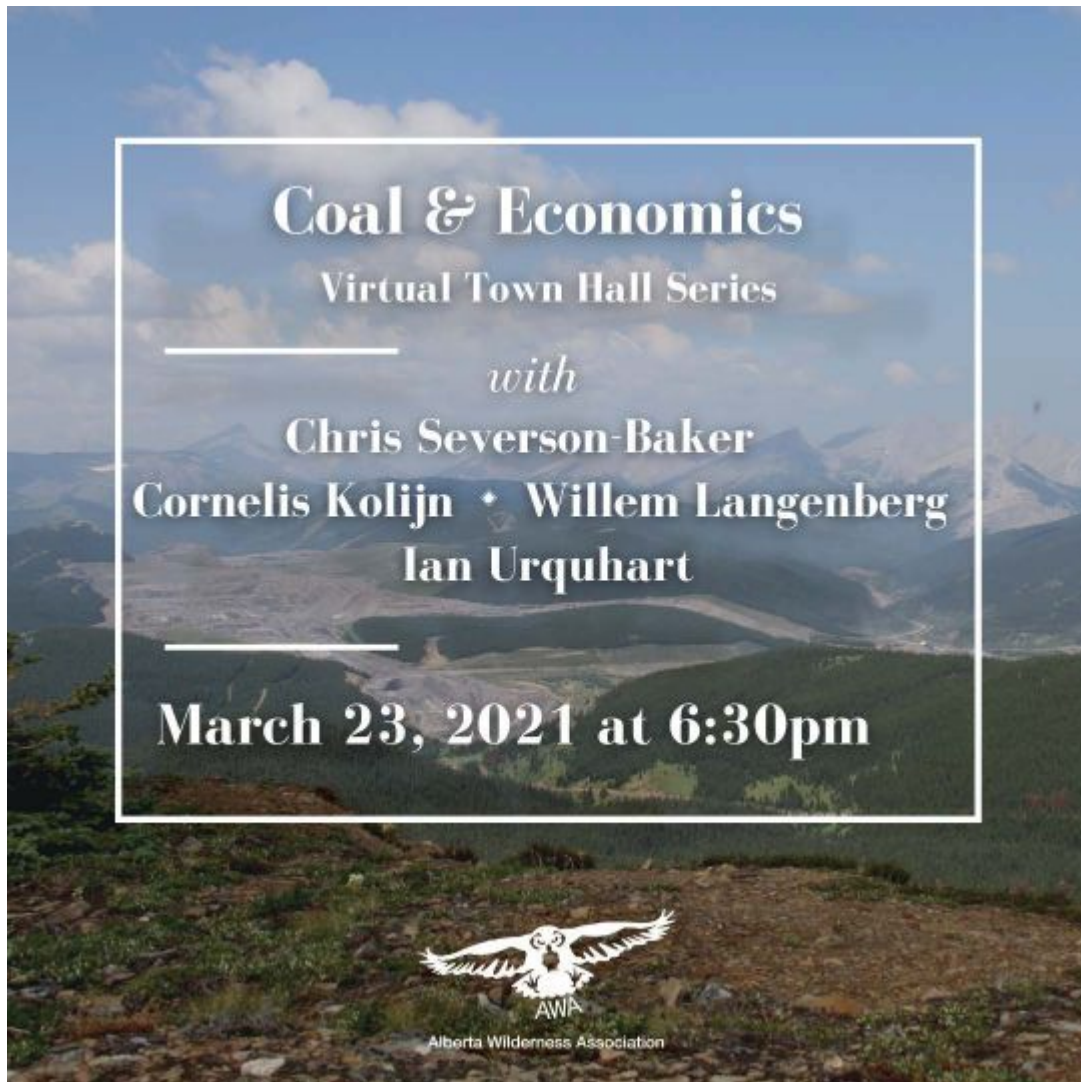


Town Hall: The Economics of Coal
